

Plant Containers & Permanent Planters

Checklist 23

ARC approval is required for plant containers and permanent planters in all front yards, corner lot street side yards and open space and golf course rear yards. Other locations do NOT require ARC approval.

This Checklist is for **GUIDANCE ONLY**, please refer to the CC&Rs and the Design Guidelines for all other specific requirements relating to your project.

ARC CHECKBOXES

- Required Documents**
 - Drawing showing container location, size, plant species and setbacks. (5' minimum)
 - Manufacturer's information on container including photo and color.

- There are no more than three (3) freestanding portable containers in the front yard, corner lot street side yards or open space/golf course rear yards. Containers in Private Space are not included in this total.

- Containers are a minimum of eighteen inches (18") square or diameter, rectangular 18"x 36" and no more than 30" high, of ceramic, clay, stone or natural appearing material. Acceptable colors include the home's main body or trim color, redwood or earth tones.

- Containers will be placed at grade on a solid level surface and have healthy live plants.

- Containers placed on each side of the garage door opening will be identical with plants of matching foliage and form and will not exceed six feet (6'-0") in height.

- Half pots, designed to be laid horizontally may be placed in all landscaped areas. Half-barrel containers in front yards, corner lot street side yards, golf course and open space rear yards are prohibited.

- Permanent planters are no more than two feet (2'-0") high and are concrete masonry units (CMU), redwood, stone or other material compatible with the home's architecture. Color is natural wood stain, earth tone, or paint compatible with home's main body or trim color.

- Containers are NOT placed on any part of the home including window sills. Containers are NOT placed on fences or the top of perimeter masonry walls.

This checklist must be completed and signed by the Owner and be submitted along with the Architectural Review Committee (ARC) Application Form.
